## Registration for IMBC 2014 Open

Warren, RI—Registration for the International Marina & Boatyard Conference (IMBC) is now available at [marinaassociation.org/imbc/registration](http://marinaassociation.org/imbc/registration). The conference is produced by the Association of Marina Industries (AMI) and will take place January 29–31, 2014, at the Greater Fort Lauderdale/Broward County Convention Center in Fort Lauderdale, FL.

Full conference passes start at \$379 and include access to all educational seminars, roundtables, and workshops, entry into the exhibit hall, and admittance to all networking events. Seminar topics for the 2014 conference include a boat hoist panel, information on federal permitting, and financial strategies for upgrading your marina as well as a special Clean Marina workshop and evening receptions. Plus, for a small price, a conference pass includes a field trip, complete with lunch and tours of three area marinas and boatyards.

“We encourage industry professionals to register early to make sure they get a space in IMBC’s special limited-attendance workshops,” AMI Chair Gary Groenewold, CMM, says. “Plus, we will be holding a special Clean Marina Workshop and Reception this year, and we’re adding a new Marina Design & Engineering track. There is so much going on this year, it might be hard to choose.”

As well as full conference passes, IMBC offers one-day passes and exhibit hall passes. AMI members receive a discount for all passes. Though the workshops are free of charge, all participants must RSVP, and the marina and boatyard field trip may be added for \$60 for AMI members and \$90 for non-members.
